## *Side Effects*

**Black Dot** - Possibly toxic to most races. Without the proper resistances, a mortal body is unable to stomach the substance for long, resulting in extreme vomiting. (Characterized by a lower case b)

**Brown Dot** - No effects apart from a hearty meal.

**Green Dot** - Therapeutic as it sends whoever eats it down memory lane and makes them feel right at home. This allows them to lose any form of exhaustion and feel less stressed regardless of their life problems.

**Red Dot** - May cause the consumer to get a tad bit tipsy or, even worse, flat out drunk. Dc15 constitution saving throw would be needed to see if the alcohol begins to take effect. Whilst under the influence, all rolls begin to be rolled with disadvantage.

**Yellow Dot** - Maybe too much for a mortal man to consume (DC14 constitution saving throw). If failed, it will cause whoever ate it to suffer 1 level of exhaustion.



# Bread

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## **B** Carrot Bread

- House specialty bread with chunks of carrot mixed into the dough resulting in it having a slightly orangish hue.

## **B** Freshly made bread

- Prepared in the early morning to let the dough to rise naturally then cooked in a wood fired oven.

## **G** Garlic Bread

- Fresh bread with small slits filled with garlic butter and lightly toasted.

## **B** Olive Bread

- A dark dough filled with pitted olives, baked, sliced, and then lightly toasted.

## **B** Seed bread

- Fresh bread encrusted with different type of seeds lightly toasted and served with a side of fresh butter.

## **G** Pumpkin Bread

- Dough filled with pumpkin seeds and spice, a gnome's favorite!

# Salad

## ⓑ Chicken Salad

*- Fresh lettuce topped with fresh chicken and pecan nuts. It is dressed with a balsamic and topped with cheese.*

## ⓑ Cold Cut Salad

*- Fresh lettuce and boiled cauliflower mixed in with cold ham bits.*

## ⓐ Crab salad (May not always be available)

*- A whole crab with meat extracted, cut up into small flakes and peppered over fresh celery and turnips. Drizzled with white wine and walnuts (optional)*

## ⓐ Fish salad

*- Fish fillet (Carp, Salmon, Swordfish or Tuna) set on a bed of cooked onions & garlic. Coated in olive oil and with fresh grapefruit on the side.*

## ⓐ Black (Sausage) Salad

*- A dish comprised of mostly meat. Most meats include goat sausage, pork sausage, steak bits all served on a singular lettuce leaf.*

## ⓑ Walnut Salad

*- Garden-lettuce packed with ample amount of walnuts, cranberries & apples. Loved by druids so much so that we have their reviews on record.*

## ⓑ Winter Squash Salad

*- Butternut squash salad is grown in our own kitchen garden, squash salad with lettuce and fresh balsamic vinegar, topped with pecan nuts.*

# Soup

## ⓑ Broccoli soup

- Stewed broccoli, potatoes, and onions in chicken broth topped off with a dash of nutmeg.

## ⓑ Cauliflower soup

- Stewed cauliflower, potatoes, carrots and celery glazed in garlic butter.

## ⓒ Grandmama's soup

- A chicken broth with chopped up potatoes, carrots, leeks and a dash of seasoning.

## ⓒ Mushroom soup

- Browed mushroom with onions, potatoes, and garlic topped off with freshly churned cream.

## Ⓨ Orc Soup

- A strange concoction of different meats that have been overly tenderized down and cooked to form a quite thick soup. Thick may be an understatement.

## ⓑ Pumpkin spice soup

- Roasted pumpkin and carrots, stewed in vegetable broth, topped off with nutmeg, cinnamon, and cream.

# Stew

## ⓑ Bone Marrow Stew

- A broth made from the bones of cows, chickens, and pigs. Additionally, it is cooked with vinegar, carrots, garlic, and onions. May cause light gagging by those with a sensitive palette.

## ⓐ Chicken stew

- A hearty stew containing carrots, onions, and chicken. An Orc's favorite when they are battered and bruised.

## ⓐ Doctor's Stew

- Made with a large number of tomatoes and apples that are left to stew with occasional cloves of garlic thrown in. Doctor's Orders.

## Ⓨ Fat Stew

- A stew comprising mostly animal fats and unwanted meats. Such meats include hooves, ears, tongue, brain, and other offal.

## Ⓨ Troll Stew

- Made from a selection of dead creatures or roadkill. We can guarantee it won't kill you but given the price, we can't assure you that it will feel good leaving the premises.

## ⓑ Vegetable Stew

- Made from a large selection of vegetables left to simmer for 8 hours before serving.

## **b** *The House Stew*

## *The House Stew Dice Results*

**DC 1** - You idly take a spoonful of the broth, not paying attention to all the warning signs. You begin letting it slide down your throat. It tastes fine at first but as soon as you go to show a slight smile, you feel something clog up your windpipe. A small shard of bone no bigger than a coin.

**DC15** constitution saving throw to be able to cough it out or else pay the penalty of **1d2** damage per turn the bone is still lodged in your throat. Party members that help you give you advantage.

**DC2** - It tastes ok. You feel as if it may not be the greatest of stews but overall it shouldn't be a problem.

**DC3** - You gobble it down with no worries. That being said the worries come later as you begin to feel your stomach rumble towards the wee hours of the evening. You better hope there's somewhere close by as you badly need to relieve yourself of the sudden compressed mass within your colon.

**DC4** - Just needs a bit of salt if you're honest. Overall not a bad stew and greatly exceeded your expectation.

## Deserts

### Ⓑ Apple Pie

Typically serves up to 8. A large pie filled with fresh apples and coated in cinnamon and sugar. Those with a sweet tooth but not much coin can typically enjoy this regardless. Typically served warm.

### Ⓑ Black Pudding

Ironically named after the quite deadly monster, it is nothing more than your run-of-the-mill chocolate pudding that has been dyed black using squid ink. It is topped off with pecans and walnuts.

### Ⓒ Cherry Doughnuts

Fried cake batter filled with diced cherries and freshly churned cream.

### Ⓒ Cherry Tart

Dough packed with Cherry Jam may result in sticky fingers.

### Ⓑ Custard

A glass of custard topped with dried sultanas. Loved by the Tiefling for some odd reason.

### Ⓑ Dry Fruits & Cheese

A large plate of dates and some differently aged cheeses to finish a good meal.

### Ⓒ Mince Pies

A small savory dessert made with different fruit peels and jams and wrapped in dough before being cooked. Typically served warm.

### Ⓑ Oily Cake

Fried cake batter lightly coated with a fine layer of sugar. A common treat for the common working folk that can afford it.

# Beverages

## Ⓡ Elven Brew

- To challenge the dwarves the elves went out of their way to make brew potent enough to knock even the strongest of their race to their asses when it comes to drinking.

## Ⓡ Hag Blood

- A fermented blend of blood from different hags that are served ounces at a time. It is said to be able to knock even the largest storm giants down in their chairs. Disclaimer: may cause some forms of paralysis and or hallucinations.

## Ⓞ Mulled Wine

- Red wine mixed with mulling spices and fruits. Typically served warm. Good for the cold winter nights or when you have the sniffles.

## Ⓞ Rice Wine

- Unsalted, soft cooked rice thoroughly cleaned and then left to ferment to form a liquid. Its bottle is normally made from a smoky glass and kept as a collector item by some.

## Ⓡ Terrasque Scales

- This company made a whiskey using pomegranates and apples. The result became a dark crimson wine with pomegranate seeds floating in the surface resembling the scales of the feared beast. The after taste leaves most with a bitter taste that begins leaving its drowsing effect with every passing second.

## Ⓞ Yellow Wine

- Made from water & cereal grains, during fermentation the liquid takes a yellowish hue, hence the name.
