Introduction

All prices quoted here are in silver pieces, and are converted from their erroneous published values by dividing by five on a ratio of 1:10:100, so five gold pieces becomes ten silver pieces. This is because the original conversion ratio was 1:10:100 with one silver piece equalling \$2, when what was apparently intended was a ratio of 1:50:500 with one silver piece equalling \$10. The advantage of valuing everything in one denomination is that it leaves prospective game masters free to set their own exchange rates between the various metals.
